Step 3 Rub well for at least 15 seconds.

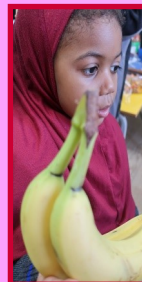
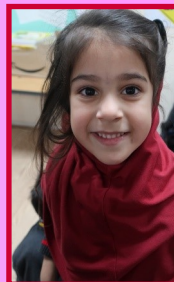


Remember
