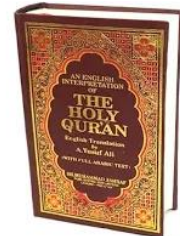

What will we be covering this term?

1st Half Term:

We will start the school year with an introduction to the sciences of Tafsir. After the introductory lesson, the students will study the Tafsir of four Surahs- Al-Fatihah, Al-Ikhlās, Al-Falaq and An-Naas.

2nd Half Term:

We will start the second half of the Autumn term with introduction to Hadith then we will start with Hadith number 1 from Imam An-Nawawi's collection. This is an essential Hadith, which covers intentions.

Islamic Studies is focused on learning lessons from the Quran and the teachings of our beloved Prophet Muhammad (PBUH). Work will be set when deemed necessary by the teacher and the standard Al Khair marking policy will be used.

Textbook title: Fiqh Note Book, The Sealed Nectar and When the moon split by Saifur Rahman Mubarakpuri

What will we be covering this term?

1st Half Term:

2nd Half Term:

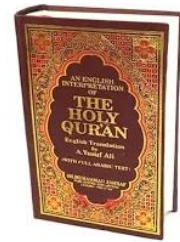

Textbook title: The Holy Quran and Stories of the Prophets

What will we be covering this term?

1st Half Term:

We will be studying the creation of man and the story of Adam (A.S). This will include in-depth discussions about Iblis and what caused him to disobey Allah. After competing for this story, we will go to study the story of the first messenger sent to earth, Prophet Nuh (A.S).

2nd Half Term:

We will continue to study stories of the prophets by looking at the lives of Hud (A.S) and Salih (A.S).

The main focus of studying the stories of the prophets is to understand the common mistakes of nations and how to protect ourselves from Allah's punishment.
