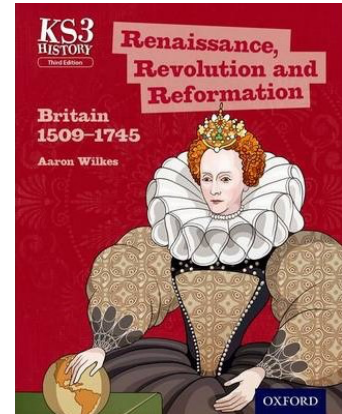

Textbook title: Renaissance, Revolution and Reformation, Britain 1509-1745



What will we be covering this term?

1st Half Term:

We will be studying the rule of King Henry VIII, Bloody Mary and Queen Elizabeth as well as the Reformation in Europe and how it affected England.

2nd Half Term:

We will be studying the emergence of the Renaissance, its causes and its effect. We will also be looking at the new wave of European exploration that led to the discovery of America. We will also spend some time looking at what the Islamic world was like during this time period.

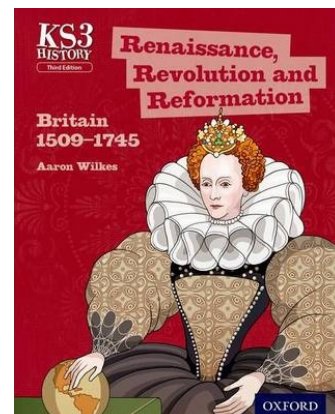
