

What will we be covering this term?

1st Half Term:

We will start the school year with an introduction to the sciences of Tafsir. After the introductory lesson, the students will study the Tafsir of Surah At-Takathur, Al-Qari'ah, Al-Aadiyat, Zalzalah and Al-Bayyinah.

2nd Half Term:

We will start the second half of the Autumn term with Hadith number 11 from Imam An-Nawawi's collection.


